

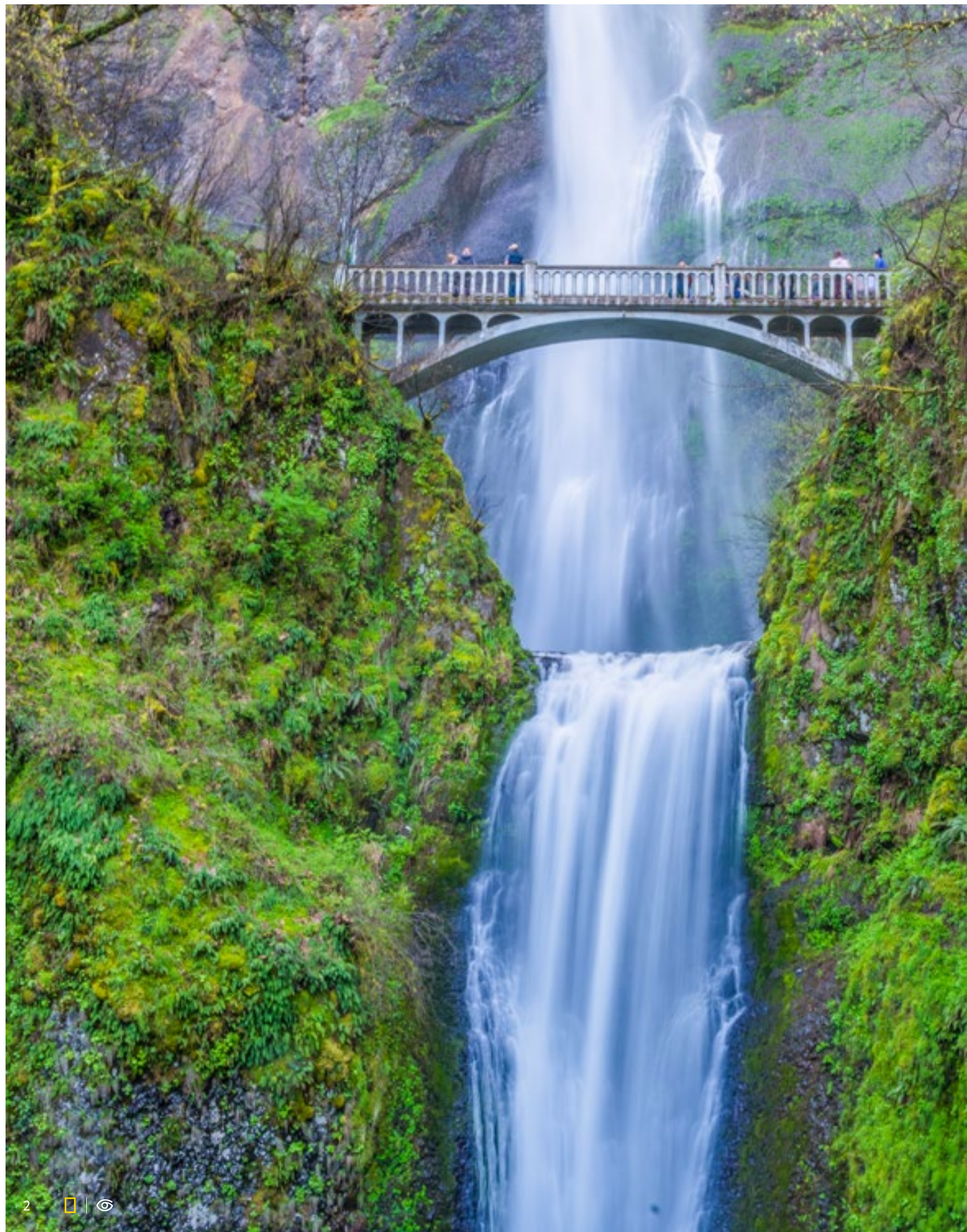


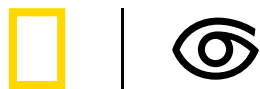

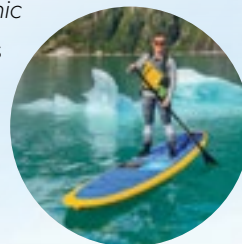

BAJA CALIFORNIA

CHANNELING THE WILD MAJESTY OF ALASKA

The dazzling glaciers and fjords that have long made Alaska an icon of expedition travel are just one chapter in the Pacific Coast's story of exploration. Farther south lies another remarkable—and often overlooked—wilderness: Baja California. For more than 45 years, Lindblad Expeditions has been guiding travelers to the marine wonders and desert isles in and around the Gulf of California, famously dubbed “the world’s aquarium” by oceanographer Jacques Cousteau.

If you’ve already explored Alaska, or are simply seeking a wild adventure that captures the true spirit of expedition travel, Baja California is an exceptional choice—and it’s surprisingly close to home.

Wildlife

The Gulf of California harbors 39% of the planet's marine mammal species and a third of all cetaceans, making for thrilling—and frequent—encounters. Spot breaching humpbacks, flying mobula rays, curious gray whales and super pods of dolphins.

More wild wonders await on shore and in the skies: Nearly a quarter of the peninsula's plant species are endemic, and the remote Isla San Pedro Martir is home to the world's largest colonies of blue-footed and brown boobies.



Immersive Exploration

Several of the fleet's Alaska expedition ships spend the winter in Baja California—they're specially designed to navigate narrow waterways and reach the remote shores that define the wildest parts of both regions.

Venture to rich waters and uninhabited isles to snorkel alongside playful sea lions; paddleboard or kayak through tangled mangroves and hidden sea caves; and hike among red rock canyons, shimmering white sand dunes and deserts filled with wildflowers.



Family Travel

Just as on our Alaska voyages, the National Geographic Explorers-in-Training program is offered on every Baja California departure, making it an ideal destination for families. Itineraries are thoughtfully designed so every generation can engage with the experience in their own way, while still creating lasting memories together.

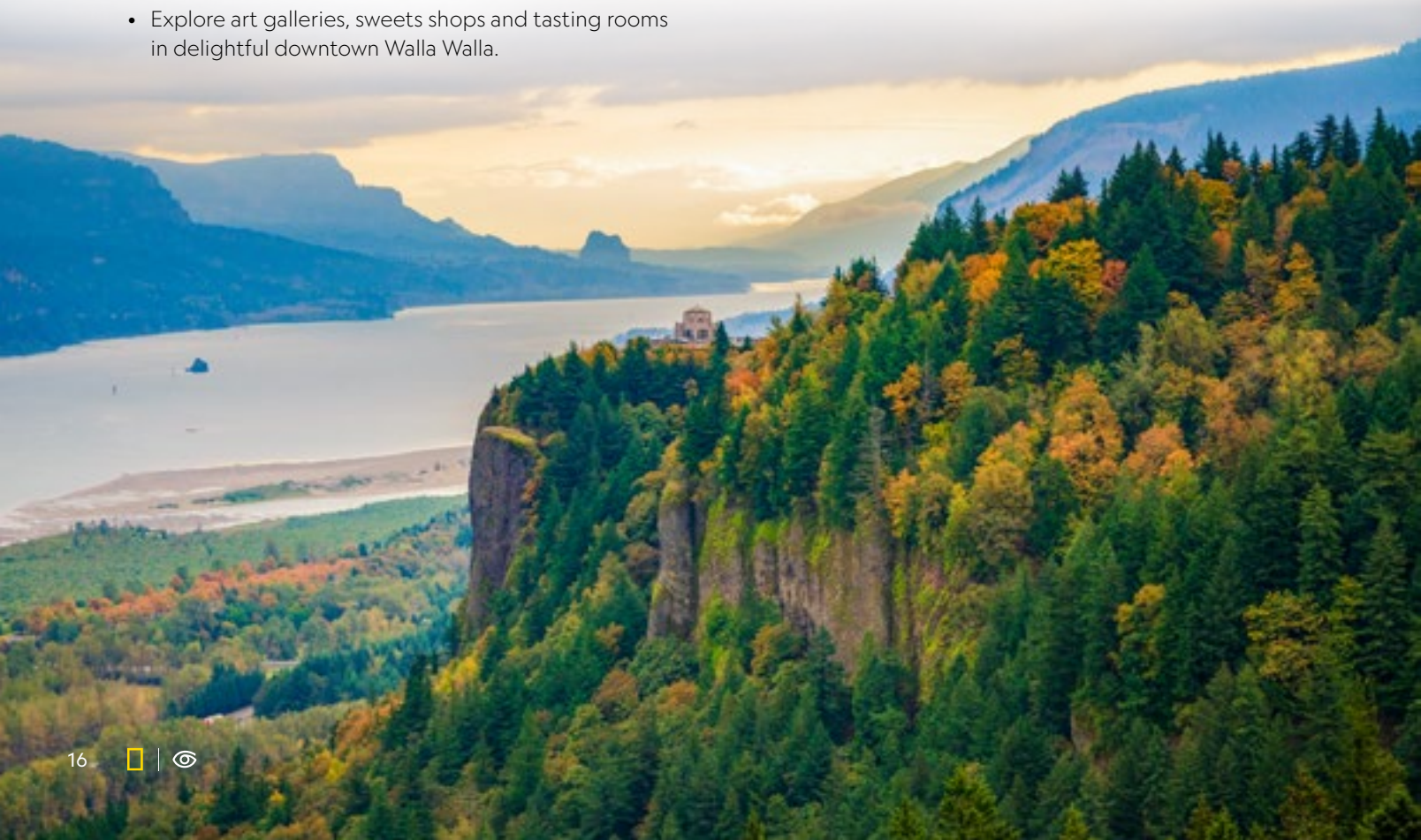
